

**Woodland Church Christian Centre,  
Clifton, Bristol**

The project involved the creation of a modern extension alongside the existing 19th century church in the heart of Clifton in Bristol.

Designed to form a light and airy open space, fitting sympathetically with the traditional architecture of the existing church, the extension provides a meeting area and café.

The external appearance features full height glazing which gives maximum use of light, complimented by an area of solid oak cladding. Internally a new stone arch was formed with full height solid oak doors as an entrance into the church.

A challenging project due to the physical constraints of the site with the building situated between the church and busy road, and with limited site accommodation. This was further complicated as the church remained in operation throughout and careful planning was required to ensure any disruption was minimised (including quiet periods for weddings) and safe access routes were maintained.

Our associated company, Blake Joinery, were also involved in this particular project. Amongst other items they created the main link doorway between the old part of the church and the new build as depicted in the bottom photograph.
